

## IN CASE OF EMERGENCY, CALL 911

**NOTE: If using a WVU telephone, you must dial 9-911.**

You should call 911 to report all emergencies, including fire alarms, bomb threats, chemical spills, medical emergencies, hazardous materials incidents, or any incident that will require a rapid response.

You will be required to provide the 911 Operator with the following information:

- Your name
- The location of the emergency (building, floor, room number)
- Your location (building, floor, room number)
- The nature of the emergency
- How many persons are involved in the emergency

Based upon the information that you supply to the 911 Operator, assistance (i.e., police, fire department personnel, hazmat team, medical personnel) will be dispatched, as required.
